# 8.3 Magazine Cover Instructions & Example

# **Background:**

As a class, we will be creating 12 issues of a magazine (only the covers), each ruler will be featured on the cover of our magazine titled:

### Mirror, Mirror on the Wall, Who is the Most Absolute of Them All?

#### Task:

You and your table team will be assigned an absolute ruler and be tasked with learning more about them by reading a biography (links to biographies are on the next page in Canvas) and doing a little research on your own if needed. You will then work together to create a magazine cover to display your absolute ruler and some of their most famous attributes.

Your magazine cover may be created digitally using Canva, Google Slides (only 1 slide), PowerPoint (only 1 slide), Google Docs (only 1 page), or it can be created by hand on paper.

## Your magazine cover must include:

- Name (and nickname if they have one) of your absolute ruler as the title
- Picture of your absolute ruler
- The country they ruled and the years they ruled over it
- Were they involved in any wars or expanding their kingdom?
- · How did they treat their people?
- How did they show they were an absolute monarch?
- What was unique or important about them?
- What was their legacy?
- Your team member names and class period (small and at the bottom is okay)
- Your assigned month (ex. January)

Each of these questions should be answered VERY BRIEFLY on the cover, making it look like there is an "article" about that topic inside your magazine.
