

ENGLAND'S TRANSITION TO A CIVIL WAR!

Queen Elizabeth I
Reign: 1558-1603

What was England's problem when she died?
She was unmarried with NO children!

Charles I
Reign: 1625-1649

Why was he fighting with Parliament?
He need tax money to fight LIARS

What happened at the long Parliament to lead to all out Civil War in 1642?

Charles agreed not to dissolve it but they could not agree on money issues + it turned to an All out Civil War!

The Petition of Right


What did it do?

Charles II
Reign: 1660-1685

What was the Restoration?
The monarchy was restored brought back.

Oliver Cromwell

Who was Cromwell?
Military general + Member of Parliament

What was the New Model Army?
Army formed by Parliament for the Civil War

What was England like under his rule?
Very Puritan - theaters + pubs closed, sports banned - NO FUN!

James II
Reign: 1685-1688

What did he do to upset Parliament?
Did not call them + fought over \$\$\$

William & Mary
Reign: 1689-1702

Why were they asked to take the throne in England?
They were Protestant + would work with Parliament

English Bill of Rights

What did it do?
It limited the King/Queen's power to share it with Parliament.

What is its significance?
Created a Constitutional Monarchy!
