2. Without looking at the map, list the seven continents and five oceans of the world.

Tuesday:

1. Which oceans border North America, and in which directions are they in relation to the continent?
2. Which labeled seas border North America?

Wednesday:

1. Why are the continents of Europe and Asia sometimes referred to as Eurasia?
2. Which continent is called both a continent and a country? Which sea separates this from New Zealand?

Thursday:

1. Name all the labeled seas that lie on the east coast of Asia.
2. The countries of Italy, India, and Japan are easy to picture due to their unique shapes. In which continents are they located?

Friday:

1. Name two inland seas that are located in Europe. Name two seas in Europe that flow into an ocean.
2. Name the labeled waterways that border Canada.

Challenge:

Without looking at the map, sketch out the world map from your mental picture of it and label as many continents, oceans, and seas as you can on the back of your bell ringer form. Compare your sketch to the map, list out what you missed in your drawing in the challenge box.
