2. Capitol Hill rises 88 feet. Which three important labeled government buildings stand on the hill?

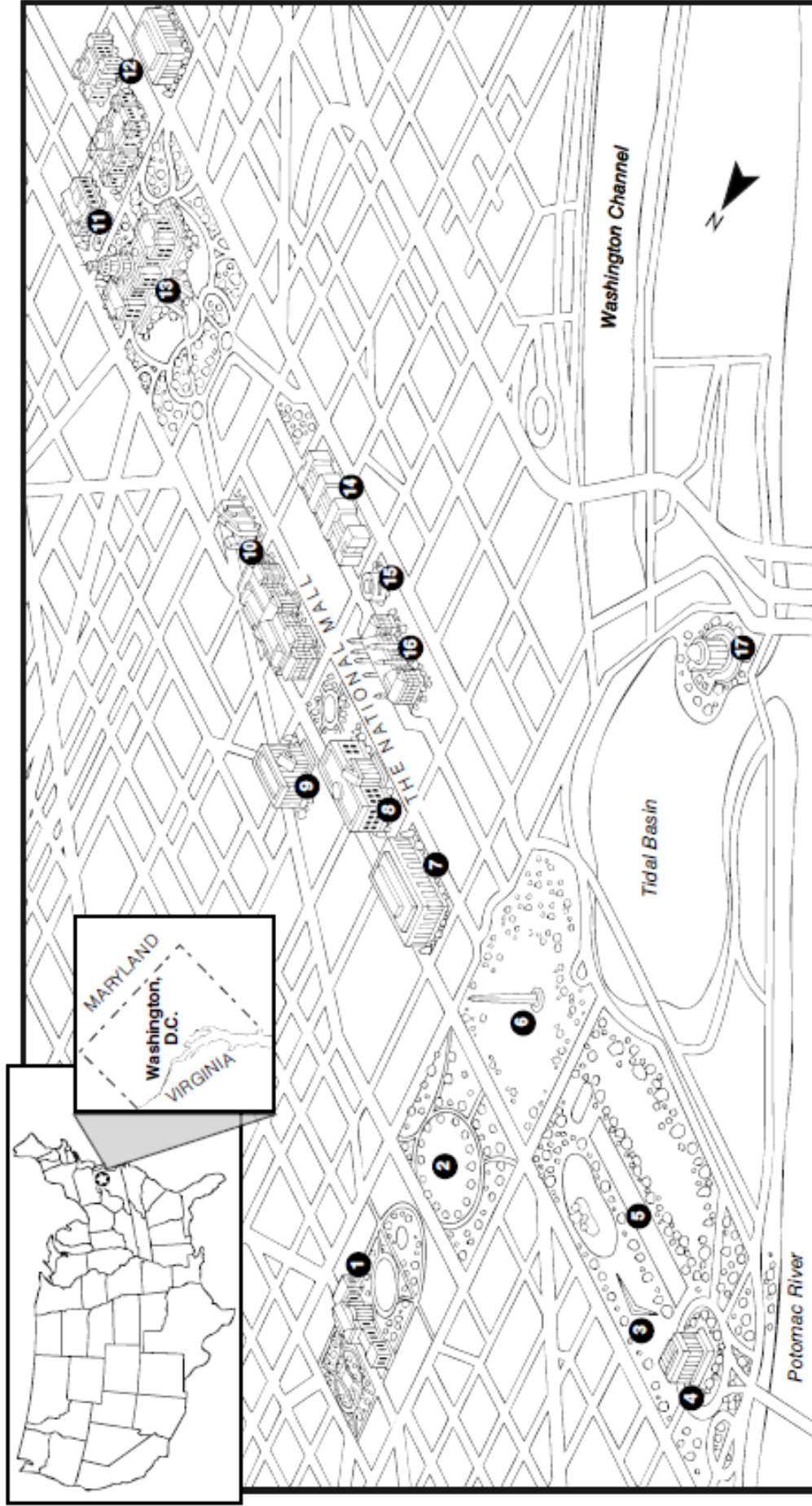
### Friday:
