2. Name three major crops that are grown in the North-Central region.

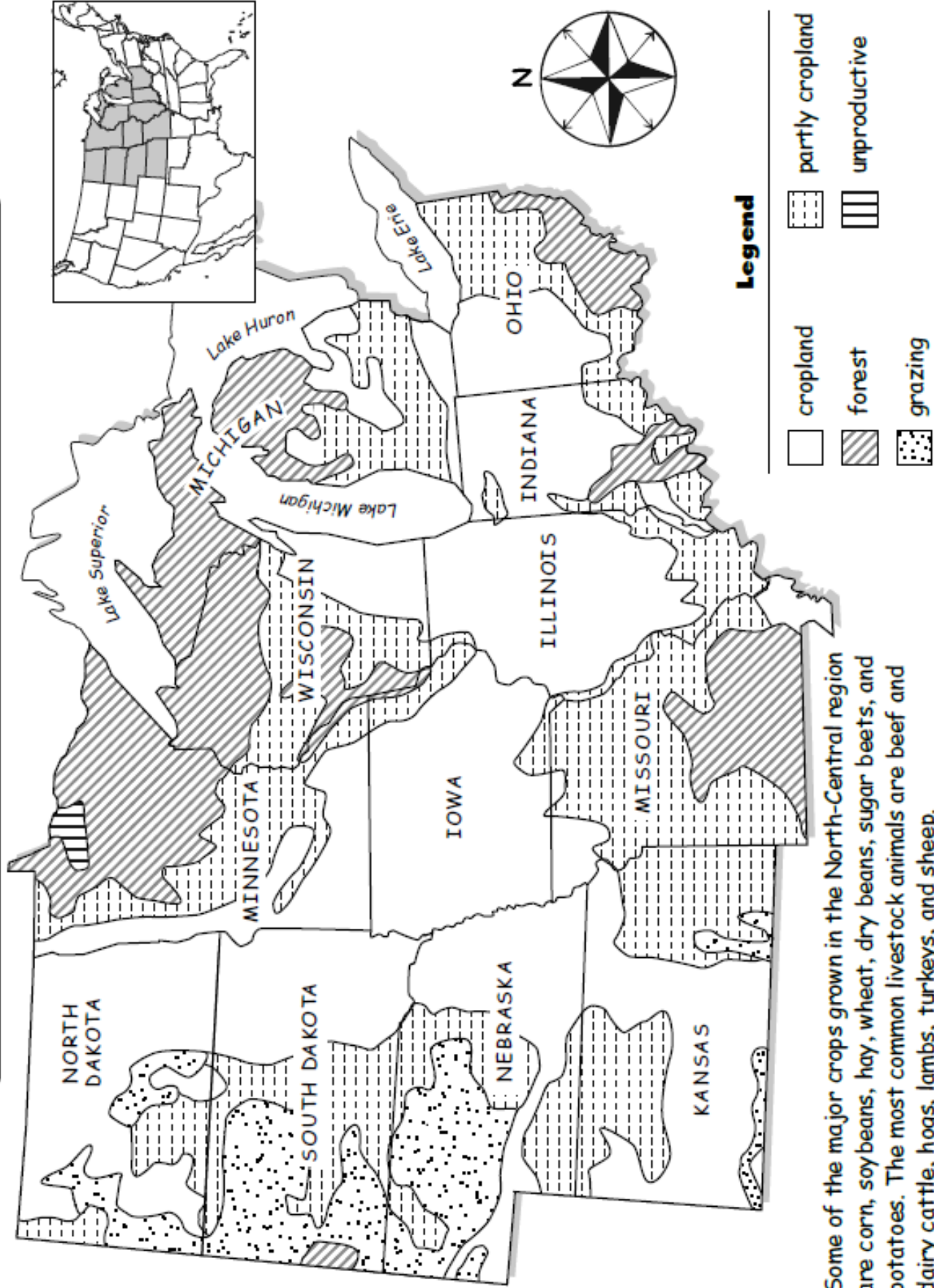
Friday:
