- 4. Terrace farming, big cities, rope bridges, architecture with stones, surgical and herbal medicine, farmed new crops like potatoes and coca plant
- 7. Advanced civilization with floating cities like Tenochtitlan, polytheistic, human sacrifices

- 13. Period in China from 403 to 221 BCE that saw Chinese states fighting and allying with each other until the state of Qin had conquered all other states and began the Qin Dynasty

- Polytheistic, strong central government, practiced sacrifices and cranial deformation
- 20. In China, it was an exam based on Confucian teachings that was used to select people for various government service jobs
- 22. World's longest man made structure built to keep invaders from the north out of China, started by the Qin Dynasty, expanded by the Han Dynasty

- 1. Trade network connecting China, the Middle East, and Europe across Central Asia
- Located on Yucatan Peninsula with independent city-states ruled by kings, polytheistic religion, built temples for sacrifices
- 3. Chinese dynasty that established the first centralized imperial government with strict rules and harsh punishments, built much of the Great Wall
- 5. Pyramids, irrigation system, abundant in gold, farmed on floating islands called chinampas
- Centered on the Yucatan Peninsula of modernday Mexico known for its massive cities of Tikal and Chichen Itza
- 8. Chinese dynasty ruled by Emperor Wu, utilized Civil Service Exam, focused on Confucianism teachings, brought China into a "Golden Age"
- Earliest known American civilization, located in southern Mexico and known for its pyramids and huge stone heads
- 11. The Western goods that were most sought after by Asians
- 12. 365 day calendar, zero, temples/pyramids, hieroglyphics, artisans, architects, astronomy
- 16. An inn with a central courtyard for travelers and traders in the desert regions of Asia along the Silk Road
- 18. Empire in modern Peru along the Andes Mountains
- 21. Powerful empire founded on Lake Texcoco (Mexico)
